





Media Summit of the Americas

Disrupting the Information Crisis & Building Media Sustainability

Overview

As leaders gathered at the Ninth Summits of the Americas in Los Angeles, finding new and effective solutions for upholding press freedom and safeguarding fact-based democratic discourse online was at the center of Building a Sustainable, Resilient, and Equitable Future for our hemisphere.

Equis Institute and the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication at Arizona State University, in partnership with the US Department of State, hosted the Media Summit of the Americas on June 7, 2022, at the historic Los Angeles Herald Examiner Building, less than one mile from the Summit Leaders Program. The Media Summit of the Americas was an in-person summit by, with, and for members of the credentialed press corps, and included key policymakers and influential civil society voices from the US and Latin America.

In a time of war and mass mistrust, research shows Spanish- and Portuguese- language disinformation, misinformation and foreign propaganda are spreading still-relatively unchecked on social media and messaging apps, eroding electoral and institutional confidence in a year of key races in the US, Colombia, and Brazil. However, that is not all the independent media is up against. Violence against journalists, state-sponsored censorship and intimidation, and economic challenges threaten the industry on a daily basis. The Media Summit addressed the critical role that media play in democracy and the serious challenges journalists face in the hemisphere.

Society cannot waste a moment mourning the harms to information integrity - creativity, resilience, education and support are required. The first convening of its kind around the Summit of the Americas, the Media Summit represented an opportunity to hear from and share best practices with some of the hemisphere's leading experts in a series of conversations, breakouts and keynotes. A multilingual event, the Media Summit tackled disrupting the crisis of trust and the spread of conspiracies, disinformation, and hyper-partisan narratives that cross language barriers online.
